

Legal Requirements and Copyright for Publishing in Asia in Focus

As the author you have responsibility for the content of your submission, however NIAS – Nordic Institute of Asian Studies is responsible for the publishing of the content. As such, it is very important for us that you make sure that the content of your piece adheres to some specific legal requirements.

- You guarantee that your work is original and previously unpublished in the same format and with near-identical content, that you have the right to publish it, and that it does not violate any existing copyright in any way.
- When publishing your article in Asia in Focus, you cannot give other journals/publishers exclusive rights to your article.
- You must check with your supervisor at your home university whether data used in your thesis can be used again in a publicly available article.
- Make sure that you only use material, graphs and pictures you have the right to use. If you do not have the copyright yourself, you need to obtain written permission to use it, and make a reference to the permission in your manuscript.
- Every picture/graph should be accredited.
- Interviewees might have agreed to participate in a research project, but not to be quoted in a publicly accessible journal. Interviewees should thus be informed and have agreed in writing to be quoted in a public article.
- When referring to specific organizations or projects/fieldwork carried out in cooperation with an organization, then you should have obtained permission in writing from the said organization to name them.
- Pictures of persons and assemblies are protected by the Personal Data Protection Act so you may need to obtain written permission to use them.
- Should your paper be accepted for publication in Asia in Focus, you will receive a publishing agreement in order to protect your rights as the author to use this article on other platforms.
